





'Baby Pete' is one of Australia's superior dwarf forms of Agapanthus. Famed for its compact nature and hardy garden performance, 'Baby Pete' is the perfect choice for low borders and edging. Throughout the warmer months it puts on a lasting, colourful show of blue flowers. In full flower 'Baby Pete' extends to a maximum height of 40-45cm, with a foliage height of just 20cm. After years of testing across the globe, no viable seed has been observed.

- Very dry tolerant once established

CARE

Easy to grow in most soil types which are well draining. Apply a slow release fertiliser in spring, no pruning required although removing spent flowering stems will encourage further flushes.
